**THE BOOK OF ROMANS**

For the next few months, we are going to be exploring the Book of Romans, from Chapter 4 onwards through our Sermons, and our Home Groups.

Romans is Paul's letter to the early Church in Rome and has much to tell us today. It has been described as St Paul's gospel in which Paul identifies humanity's need for salvation, identifies Jesus as God's chosen unique means of salvation and looks at what that means in how Christians should live and relate to others.
